



FINDINGS FROM THE ANALYSIS OF EVIDENCES OF ASSESSMENT TERM-II, 2015-16

NO. OF SCHOOLS WHO'S EVIDENCES HAVE BEEN ANALYZED: 8900

I. FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT TASKS:

- 62.74% schools gave 3 tasks in i.e. FA's – One written task, one individual activity and one group activity, an improvement is observed from 56.50% schools in Term-I, 2015-16. 23.03% schools had given one written task and two activities (either both are individual or both are group). 9.18% gave either all written tasks or all activities. 5.05% schools assigned more than four activities or have not submitted any evidences.
- 36.84% schools have adopted 'Best score of individual and group activity and averaged it with the written assessment', 30.26% schools have used "Best Score of all tasks", 27.50% schools have adopted 'Average of the tasks', while for remaining 5.41% schools, information about grading is not available.
- Around 32.22% schools have adequately integrated values and problem solving abilities in Formative Assessment activities. In around 43.53% schools this integration is upto an average level.
- 45.32% schools have provided reports and evidences on formative assessment of all students and all tasks including well defined rubrics and parameters of assessment. 34.52% schools have provided evidences of few tasks and few students and have used parameters for assessment but they are not very well defined. 17.70% schools have provided very limited evidences and parameters of assessment are not specified, while the other 2.46% schools have not provided any evidences.
- In Class Test/Unit Test, 30.43% schools have given 1 written task, 54.86% schools have given 2 – 4 written tasks while 8.43% schools have given more than 5 written tasks to the students.

II. PROJECT WORK:

- 76.20% schools have sent the evidences regarding project work. These projects are multi-disciplinary, authentic and relevant in around 24.65% schools.
- Students did the project work individually in 28.54% of the schools. Around 18.23% schools gave group projects. Around 36.12% schools gave both Individual and group projects.
- 77.36% projects were found relevant, 69.95% were original and 41.80% projects were multi-disciplinary. 38.03% projects were time- consuming.

III. LAB ACTIVITIES/PRACTICALS:

- In around 32% schools, marking in lab activities/practicals is done as per parameters. Around 31.30% schools have not submitted any evidences. Around 40.07% schools have submitted their practical/observation records.

IV. CO-SCHOLASTIC ASSESSMENTS:

- 47.14% schools have provided detailed reports and evidences of Co-Scholastic Assessment in this term, 33.95% schools provided reports and evidences but these were lacking in proper details. The percentage of schools not provided evidences of co-scholastic assessment is 5.62%.
- Variety of tasks and tools has been used covering all Co-Scholastic Areas in 46.17% schools, limited variety of tasks and tools are used in 31.16% schools.
- In nearly 64% schools, teachers have done team assessment and in 61.62% schools, they have used positive comments for the students.
- The students have been observed over a period of time in different situations in 63.85% schools. They have been given enough opportunities to discover and nurture their talents in around 65.15% schools. In the remaining schools, insufficient evidences have been provided in this regard. Counselling has been done by the teachers in 49.21% schools.
- Overall, the assessment and evaluation of co-scholastic areas have shown an improvement in the schools over the past years.

V. OVERALL PERFORMANCE:

- Teacher's Diary/Notes are well planned and cover all aspects in 26.30% schools and average in 27.39% schools. But around 46.32% schools have either sketchy Teacher's Diary/Notes or do not have them at all.
- Students are regular (more than 75% attendance) in 81.44% schools, regular to some extent (60 – 74% attendance) in 10.86% schools and are either irregular or no evidence has been provided from 7.70% schools.
- In 61.56% schools, teachers have attended the training programmes conducted by the Board or its empanelled agencies.
- A positive correlation of 0.2 is there between the school's performance (overall marks scored) and whether the teachers have attended any training programmes or not. Also, a similar positive correlation (0.2) is there between the school's performance and the number of teachers being trained by CBSE or its empaneled agency. It implies that those schools in which the teachers are trained have performed better and scored higher marks.
- On the basis of Subject Evaluator's overall Feedback Report of the schools, 35.57% schools are good; **most of the schools rate Average (52.88%)** and 11.55% schools need improvement.
